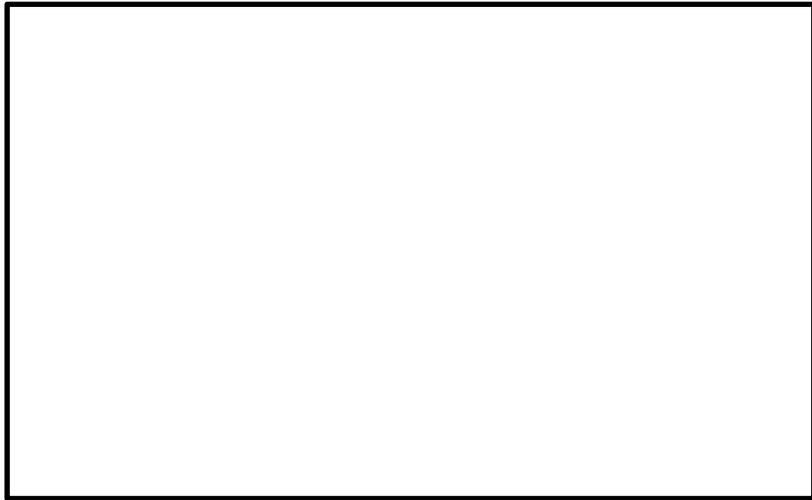
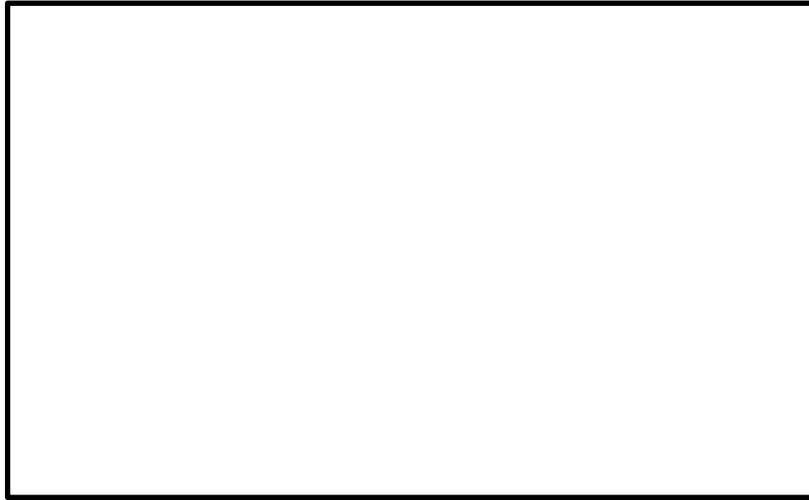


## Planning the Composition of a Landscape

1. Establish a *horizon line*, the eye level at which the sky and ground meet.
  - A low horizon line creates a lot of sky.
  - A high horizon line creates a lot of land.
  - Be careful not to place a horizon line directly in the middle; adjust it so that it is just above or below center to keep it interesting.
2. Plan your main shapes.
  - Sprinkle them around the page to create a sense of movement.
  - Make sure your shapes are larger in the foreground and get smaller as you move up the page toward the background.





Note: Look for areas where you can overlap shapes. This will create a greater sense of deep space.
